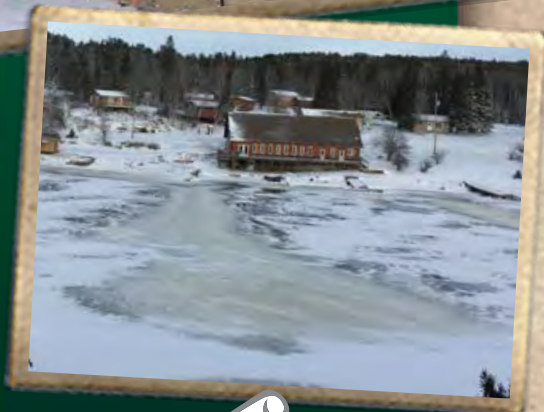
Notes for November
